Born in Georgia and raised in Nashville from age 15, Vicki spent her formative years on Music Row, immersed in the music business at The Sound Lab Recording Studio, where her father was president. Here, she honed her craft as a demo and backup singer, performing across genres—Country, R&B, Pop, Jazz, and Gospel. Her diverse background ignited a passion for creating music that transcends boundaries, and with each song, she weaves heartfelt stories, real-life struggles, and timeless memories.

Her fourteen song album *Butterfly*, reflects the many transformations in her life and heart. Inspired by a season of profound change, including the passing of her father in 2020, Vicki included three of his songs as a tribute. *Butterfly* embodies hope, faith, and new beginnings—a journey she shares with her listeners. Vicki's music invites people to connect, heal, and find inspiration, offering universal truths and emotions in every note.



Her first single digital and video release from the *Butterfly* album is, “To Make You Feel My Love” featuring Chris Luezing on acoustic and electric guitar.
